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

Institute for Social Democracy came into existence in the backdrop of unprecedented violent conflict that South Asia has witnessed over several decades. Now they have become a routine affair. Thousands of women, men and children fell victim to this madness. ISD was established by late Dr. Khurshid Anwar and its work on Composite Heritage was his brainchild. ISD has chosen Composite Heritage as a tool for conflict transformation and violence prevention as no other organisation has yet taken it up. Composite Heritage is chosen as a tool, because of the fact that irrespective of the caste, religion and gender every individual relates to it. It belongs to masses, not an individual. The initial objective of ISD was to provide a common platform for groups and individuals committed to secularism and democracy, to explore and affirm Composite Heritage as a basis for peace and democracy. With this objective in mind, we initiated our intervention through the perspective building and capacity building on the context of conflict and bringing Composite Heritage as a tool to restore Peace, Harmony and Democracy. Through our interventions, we learnt that there is almost total lack of peace movements in the context of sectarian violent and non-violent conflict such as communal, caste, ethnic, linguistic and regional conflicts. In sub-continent, there is a movement for peace when it comes to war and nuclear race issues. There is also a strong and significant feminist movement but when it comes to conflicts mentioned above, our efforts become only reactive. We assume that there is peace because there is no visible conflict. We remain until and unless we are confronted with violent conflicts. Once the violent conflict is invisible, we again assume that there is peace. The biggest lesson that we learnt through these years is that the absence of violent conflict does not mean peace. We also learnt that there are always sources of tension present in the society and they become visible as and when the forces behind the sources become proactive. On the contrary, we also realize that in a given society there are always "Local Capacities for Peace" present. Though we always require them to remain on the surface and help to keep peace and harmony intact we hardly become proactive. During our journey we have evolved not just as an organisation but also the concept of Composite Heritage has evolved and new dimensions are added to it.


Accepting identities, differences, empathizing with socio-political and cultural aspiration of various social groups, opening dialogue without questioning intentions.

- Converting findings and outcome of the workshop into simple easy accessible materials for popular education and public mobilization, with a particular focus on rural communities in Hindi speaking belt of North India.

For fulfilling our vision while keeping our beliefs intact, we have adopted a few strategies and have developed our working areas. For this purpose ISD works on two broad themes one is Composite Heritage and the other is Local Capacity for Peace.


COMPOSITE HERITAGE



Local Capacities for Peace

The strategy of LCP focused on establishing peace among communities is very close to the concept of Composite Heritage. ISD has started workshop and other activities around 2005 and it continues unabated till date. Much like workshops and activities around Composite Heritage the spread of LCP is from national grass root to South Asia.

Under the Local Capacity Building programme, we provide training and workshops on conflict transformation tool and developed the understanding of youth so that they can analyze society conflict and seek solutions with the help of their culture.



AREA OF INTERVENTIONS

ISD was registered as a trust and its structure has been constituted accordingly. The core team of the organisation which designs and conducts different programmes is based in New Delhi which is also the head office of the organisation.

Programme of ISD or one call it social intervention is spread over many levels. The Delhi office grassroots-level work is managed by a team of activists associated with ISD. Apart from this ISD conducts many other activities with help from comrades of the network. Some organizations and individuals are putting their efforts into many tools and methods to establish peace and harmony as per the needs of the regions. In that process geographically ISD has its direct and indirect interventions in various parts of the country and along with national intervention ISD also works with South Asian Countries.


Direct Intervention

OUR PROGRAMME AND ACTIVITIES

Allahabad Activities – Highlights

- The May Day committee decided to organize a cultural programme. Azamgarh IPTA team was invited to perform Jangeet and folk dance. People connected with the Jangeets and enjoyed it.
- Composite Heritage workshop organised from 23rd – 25th May 2017 at Karelabagh with women who made baskets or work as ragpickers. Facilitator explained Composite Heritage to the participants.
- Composite Heritage workshop organised from 29th June to 1st July, 2017 with students. Facilitator talked about the people's struggle of 1857 in the context of Allahabad. He/She also discussed violent conflicts and their impact on children.
- Gender Training – 8th to 10th June 2017 with 23 adolescents. Facilitator introduced the concept of Gender and which helped them to understand how society stereotyped emotions, feelings, and also our nature.
- In Karelabagh Basti Eid Milan was organized. Children from Laal colony, Sadiyapur mod also joined with Karelabagh children.
- In Allahabad, ISD organized a Kajri Mahotsav programme in Bal Bharti School on Sunday. Kajri is a form of folk songs of Uttar Pradesh which women sang during sawan.
- Independence Day was celebrated in Karelabag jointly with both the Bal-Bagicha Karelabagh Sadiapur. They came together to decorate the place they were told about the freedom struggle and the heroes.
- Composite Heritage workshop in Padilla from 17th -19th August 2017 and Saifkhanpur from 1st -4th September 2017
- Three-day Gender Training in Girls Chandra Srivastava Junior High School Machli Shahar was organised from 11th – 13th September 2017. Facilitator told the participants about the taboo related to girls and different practices towards boys and girls.
- Sirjan in Allahabad city was held on 10th November in Bal Bharti School. A very beautiful programme of Dastangoi by Ankit Chaddha, Bindu Malini, Vedant, and Ajay Tipania was conducted.
- Bal Diwas was organised on 20 November 2017 in Karela Bagh. The programme started with a small speech on Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and his idea of India.
- Our annual programme called Sirjan of Allahabad was organised from 18th-22nd January 2018 at Prashasan Pandal, Magh Mela Allahabad. This was the 10th year of Sirjan. Indeed this is an achievement for us.
- In Karelabag Basti Composite Heritage workshop was conducted with children from 19th to 21st February.
- Holi Milan and Women's Day Celebration in different Bastis of Karelabag and Gaughat was organised in March. The programme started with a brief introduction to women's day's history. We also shared the struggle of Savitri Bai Phule for Women's education and their rights.

Himachal Pradesh Activities – Highlights

- As ISD has taken up the task of reviving Composite Heritages in its working areas so for this purpose some formal and informal meetings and workshops were conducted in Himachal Pradesh. Meetings were conducted from 12th April 2017 to 9th August 2017.
- In Khouli village, the workshop was held on the 12th of April 2017 with local farmers and artists.
- In Barnal village, a meeting was held with women on 2nd May 2017.
- In Teel village workshop held with youth and students on 1st and 2nd June 2017
- In Gashani village, a meeting was held on 9th August 2017 with villagers.
- The team of ISD discussed the village issues, local Composite Heritages, and festivals in this meeting.
- Workshop along with the seminar was organised from 13th -15th October 2017 in Khouli, Himachal Pradesh. The workshop was on knowledge of traditional herbs and local Composite Heritages.
- A Meeting was organised in Mohani villages to celebrate local Composite Heritage called Fire Dance on 18th -19th November 2017
- Youth exposure visit under Local capacities for Peace program in Himachal Pradesh was organised to Shansher on 7th and 8th November 2017
- A meeting with youth was organised at Thirthan Bhawan on 7th and 8th December 2017. Facilitator shared the concept of LCP and experiences related to it.
- LCP Follow-up meeting was organised in Himachal Pradesh on 2nd and 3rd January 2017.
- A story-telling programme was conducted in the remote village of the district Ghashini and Teel on 12th January 2018.
- On the occasion of Faguli festival, a meeting on the revival of Composite Heritage was organised with women in Teel village on 8th February 2018.
- Annual programme of ISD in Himachal called Chetru Veeth was organised with children of Teel Panchyat and nearby villages on 4th March 2018.

Jharkhand Activities - Highlights

- ISD organised workshops with youth in Jharkhand to revive and popularizing the Composite Heritage in the region.
- In this series, a five days drama workshop from 6th to 10th June 2017 was conducted in Nutandih Jharkhand.
- ISD's annual programme in Jharkhand called Raska Raso Porob was organised in Nutandih, Bango and Potka on 24th and 25th June 2017. In this programme various cultural activities were performed by the local artist and youth of the village.
- ISD organized regular meetings in Baghmara, Ranikuder and Tilaitad villages with youth on 3rd - 4th October 2017 to promote the local folk songs and forms of different tribal areas.
- Two days Composite Heritage workshop with youth was organised on 18th and 19th February 2018 at Jamshedpur. Facilitator discussed the gender issues and related concepts. He also talked about the local Composite Heritages.
- An exposure visit of Khunti-(Birthplace of Birsa Muda) for Nutandih youth was organised by ISD on 4th March 2018. So that they can learn about their heroes.
- Youth of Jamshedpur region visited Dumra village for an exposure visit and talked to women and men of the village.
- To introduce the concept and principles of Do No Harm/ Local Capacities for Peace ISD organised a two-day meeting with local civil society members and youth at Sakchi, Jamshedpur on 6th and 7th December 2017.
- ISD organised a three days workshop with local youth of three areas (Nutundih, Gopalpur and Jamshedpur) from 23rd to 25th December 2017

Jaunpur Activities – Highlights

- Three programs were conducted in different villages by ISD to mark international women's day a meeting was conducted in Furkania village of Sahganj Block on 4th April 2017 on 10th April 2017 it was conducted in Moinuddeen Mahalla.
- One day programme was organised on the occasion of –birth Anniversary of Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar at Nagar Panchyat Khetasarai Jaunpur on 14th April 2017.
- Three days training program for students (boys and Girls) was organised from 18th to 20th July 2017 at Furkaniya Higher secondary school Shahitalab, Khetasarai Jaunpur.


